Hospice Ethiopia Celebrates 20th Anniversary

During the most recent World Hospice and Palliative Care Day, Hospice Ethiopia commemorated its 20-year anniversary through a celebratory webinar. During this event, partners, collaborators and friends of Hospice Ethiopia shared their reflections on all that Hospice Ethiopia has accomplished since its inception.

Hospice Ethiopia began in 2003 with one health care worker, Sr. Tsigerada Yisfawessen. What began with providing home-based care to one patient quickly grew to 10 in the first year. Services have greatly expanded since then with the addition of a vehicle which helps to provide home-based care and partnership with nine hospitals across the region and in Addis Ababa. The service area for Hospice Ethiopia has increased to ten sub-cities in Addis Ababa.





Hospice Ethiopia's commitment to compassionate and holistic care has only grown in the past 20 years. The organization has made education and advocacy top priorities. Many health care workers have been trained to provide palliative care services, and Hospice Ethiopia has partnered with many different institutions to create national guidelines and training manuals for palliative care services. Working with the Ministry of Health, Hospice Ethiopia is working to create strategic guidance on how palliative care services can be scaled up across the country.

Hospice Ethiopia has had tremendous successes over the past 20 years. We look forward to continued engagement with them and their US partner, Snowline Hospice, to see what they will accomplish over the next 20 years!

The UN Declares October 29th First "International Day of Care and Support"
