APCA recently published a story in ehospice about our collaborative scholarship program which supports training the next generation of palliative care providers in Africa. The 2023-24 cohort included 11 scholarships awarded to nine nurses and two social workers for training levels including certificate, diploma, post-graduate diploma, bachelor's and master's degrees. Students are studying at the Institute of Hospice and Palliative Care at Hospice Africa Uganda, Nairobi Hospice in Kenya, University of Cape Town in South Africa and Kamuzu University of Health Sciences in Malawi.




